

# LIVE PRODUCTION AND SERVICES

(Set Construction)

## *Build Your Career In Set Construction*



**Certificate III in Live Production Services (Set Construction) will develop the skills required to work in the area of constructing sets, props and scenery for productions, events or exhibitions in the film, television and entertainment industries, and also provides a pathway to an apprenticeship in the construction industry.**

**This course covers essential skills such as:**

- Following Work, health and safety procedures
- Using hand tools, power tools and workshop machinery
- Working within a team environment
- Reading plans and applying measurements and calculations

## CUA30415 Certificate III in Live Production and Services

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who apply a broad range of competencies in providing services for the entertainment industry. They may provide assistance with technical support to a team.

### Set Construction Stream

The units of competency selected for this course focus on the skills required to undertake scenery and set construction for productions in the entertainment industry.

† 7 Units of competency can be used for credit transfer for some construction qualifications.

### COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no entry requirements for this qualification.

Illawarra ITeC require students to have average english, reading and writing skills, or higher and should have completed Year 10 or above schooling, or have sound workplace written communication skills. Participants will be required to complete a Language, Literacy & Numeracy (LLN) Assessment prior to enrolment.

### UNITS OF STUDY

To be awarded a full qualification in CUA30415 - Certificate III in Live Production and Services (Set Construction) you will need to be assessed as competent in 6 core plus 9 elective units of competency (15 units of competency). A Statement of Attainment will be issued for units deemed competent if a full qualification is not achieved.

## **DELIVERY**

This course can be delivered as class based, mixed mode (workshops and distance/correspondence) and may also be eligible to be delivered as an on-the-job Traineeship, through VET in Schools or as a School Based Traineeship.

### ***Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL):***

The skills, knowledge and experience you have gained from your previous learning, work experience and life in general may be taken into account. To apply for Recognition of Prior Learning in one or more units you must clearly show that you have the equivalent and relevant skills, knowledge and experience of the unit or group of units.

### ***Credit Transfer:***

If you have successfully completed exactly the same unit of competency or a unit similar in content and outcome to one in your current course, your previous result may be transferred (Credit Transfer). Your assessor will decide whether you are able to receive an automatic Credit Transfer.

## **STUDENT SUPPORT**

The Illawarra ITeC is committed to ensuring that all students are offered:

### **COURSE FEES**

Some students may be eligible for concession fees or a scholarship (under NSW Smart & Skilled).
